Lewis Black, President & CEO of Almonty said, "This quarter represents the low point of the current commodity price cycle and our operating results were in line with expectations. Prices averaged a low of US\$175/MTU for the three months to the end of March and have since rebounded to the \$220 level in Q3. We are also seeing a squeeze on the availability

of tungsten concentrate in the western market currently, which should bode well for future prices. Our continued focus on cost control, as evidenced by our decision to cease mining activity at Wolfram Camp while we finish the optimization process, puts the Company on solid footing to take advantage of the expected increase in the commodity price going forward.

We are also pleased to be able to appoint POSCO Engineering & Construction Co. as the pre-EPC contractor on our flagship Sangdong Tungsten mine. POSCO's work has already commenced and we are targeting July 2016 for the EPC work to begin. This is yet another step towards seeing the project commissioned in 2017."

### **About Almonty**

The principal business of Toronto, Canada-based Almonty Industries Inc. is the mining, processing and shipping of tungsten concentrate from its Los Santos Mine in western Spain, its Wolfram Camp Mine in north Queensland, Australia and its Panasqueira mine in Portugal as well as the development of the Sangdong tungsten mine in Gangwon Province, Korea and the Valtreixal tin/tungsten project in north western Spain. The Los Santos Mine was acquired by Almonty in September 2011 and is located approximately 50 kilometres from Salamanca in western Spain and produces tungsten concentrate. The Wolfram Camp Mine was acquired by Almonty in September 2014 and is located approximately 130 kilometres west of Cairns in northern Queensland, Australia and produces tungsten and molybdenum concentrate. The Panasqueira mine, which has been in production since 1896, is located approximately 260 kilometres northeast of Lisbon, Portugal, was acquired in January 2016 and produces tungsten concentrate. The Sangdong mine, which was historically one of the largest tungsten mines in the world and one of the few long-life, high-grade tungsten deposits outside of China, was acquired in September 2015 through the acquisition of a 100% interest in Woulfe Mining Corp. Almonty also has an option to acquire a 100% ownership interest in the Valtreixal tin-tungsten project in northwestern Spain.
